<b>Vocational Rehabilitation</b> : If you have a disabling condition that interferes with your ability to work, you may be eligible for Vocational Rehabilitation services. Disabling conditions may be physical, mental/emotional, or learning disabilities, which are diagnosed by a certified person. If you think you may have such a condition but are not diagnosed, VR can evaluate you to see if you qualify. VR services include training, adaptive equipment, job development and placement, job coaching, supported employment, job retention, and community based assessments. Job related services are provided without regard to income. For individuals with limited income, services can also include mental or physical restoration, transportation, home or job modifications, and other services. Local contact number:  Address:
