## CHANGE NOTICE FOR MANUAL NO. 22-10, DSH AND FQHC LOCATIONS

#### I. CONTENT OF CHANGE

- **A.** It is a responsibility of the county department of social services (DSS) to provide an Income Maintenance Caseworker (IMC) at each Disproportionate Share Hospital (DSH) and Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC) as an outstation location to take MPW and MIC applications. The DSS must have a written agreement with each DSH and FQHC facility. The agreement must be signed by the dss director and updated yearly.
- **B.** Hospitals and health center facilities submit an eligibility worksheet each year to DMA to determine their eligibility as a DSH or as a FQHC for the next federal fiscal year. If the worksheet is not submitted, the DSH/FQHC facility cannot be eligible. If the facility meets all requirements to receive status as a DSH/FQHC facility, they are notified by a letter from DMA of their eligibility. Correspondence regarding DSH/FQHC eligibility is sent to the hospital/health center facility chief financial officer. If the chief financial officer has any questions he may contact the DMA Finance Office.
- C. The list of Disproportionate Share Hospitals (DSH) and Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHC) are updated and placed on our DMA website at <a href="http://www.ncdhhs.gov/dma/county/">http://www.ncdhhs.gov/dma/county/</a> listed as DSH and FQHC Locations. If the facility director claims that the facility is eligible as a DSH/FQHC facility and you do not see the facility listed as such on the website, request a copy of the eligibility letter from the facility chief financial officer. Honor the facility's letter of DSH/FQHC eligibility from DMA. The facility may be DSH/FQHC eligible and not yet added to the website list.

**D.** The DMA website will be updated with additions and deletions of facilities. Please review the list periodically and make any necessary adjustments regarding staffing at outstation locations in your county.
